Corporate Talk Series – 1

Introduction

The Department of Management (MBA) at Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Technology organized the first session of the Corporate Talk Series on February 6, 2025. The session featured Mr. Ayush Jain, Senior Vice President at Loan Frame, as the resource person. The session provided valuable insights into the essential skills required to get hired, the real interview questions candidates face, and the key attributes corporates look for in potential employees. Additionally, the discussion highlighted the significance of choosing the right job, one that not only provides employment but also shapes an individual's career trajectory.

Details of the Session:

Mr. Ayush Jain started the session by addressing the actual filters that companies use to evaluate candidates. He emphasized that beyond academic qualifications, employers prioritize problem-solving abilities, adaptability, and a proactive approach to challenges. The key skills that corporates seek include:

1. **Technical Proficiency & Industry Knowledge:** Candidates must be well versed in industry trends and possess relevant technical expertise.
2. **Critical Thinking & Problem-Solving:** Employers look for individuals who can analyse situations and provide effective solutions.
3. **Communication & Interpersonal Skills:** The ability to convey ideas clearly and work collaboratively is a major differentiator.
4. **Emotional Intelligence & Adaptability:** Companies value candidates who can handle pressure and adapt to changing business environments.
5. **Leadership & Decision-Making:** A potential leader who can take initiative is always preferred.

Conclusion The Corporate Talk Series 1 provided students with a comprehensive understanding of the hiring process, corporate expectations, and strategic job selection. Mr. Ayush Jain's insights equipped students with the knowledge to refine their job search approach, improve their interview performance, and make informed career decisions. The session concluded with an engaging Q&A round, where students received personalized advice on their career aspirations.

Overall, the event was highly interactive and beneficial, reinforcing the need for continuous skill development and strategic career planning. The Department of Management aims to conduct more such sessions in the future to bridge the gap between academia and corporate expectations.



Mock Stock Competition

The Mock Stock Competition, organized by the Department of Management, MAIT, in association with the Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE), was designed to give students practical exposure to stock market trading.

The event began with an introduction to Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Technology (MAIT), highlighting its commitment to providing real-world financial learning experiences for students. Our esteemed guest, Prof. Sanjeev Das, was welcomed with a sapling, presented by Sangeeta Ma'am, HOD of the Management Department.

The *Mock Stock Competition* was a 'ring trading' simulation that mimicked traditional open-outcry trading at the Bombay Stock Exchange. The competition featured 10 leading companies: Reliance Industries, Tata Motors, ONGC, SBI, Infosys, Cipla, Tata Steel, Ambuja Cement, ITC, Dabur.

Each company had one broker responsible for trading and one operator who recorded stock buy-sell entries. A total of 35 teams participated as traders, actively negotiating stock prices and conducting transactions. Every team was required to complete a minimum of seven transactions within the one-hour trading session.

Trading Process and Results

After the rules were outlined, Prof. Sanjeev Das gave a detailed explanation of how the competition would work, providing a brief on how the trading would unfold.

The atmosphere quickly became filled with hustle and chaos, similar to the actual ring trading process. Participants engaged in live trading by negotiating and persuading their fellow traders to buy and sell stocks at optimal prices. The fast-paced environment encouraged quick decision-making and strategic investment choices. Once transactions were completed for a company, the board managers updated the LTP (Last Traded Price), noting the price change in green for an increase and in red for a decrease. The percentage change was also calculated accordingly.

To add tension and excitement to the environment, rumors and news regarding both profitable and negative stock movements were shared on the board. Teams had to carefully analyze whether the news was beneficial or detrimental to their strategies and decide accordingly. With only seven minutes left in the trading period, the final details were updated, and the real-life closing prices were recorded.

After the one-hour session, trading logs (Sauda Sheets) were collected from all the teams. The final portfolio values were calculated, considering stock prices and total holdings. The team with the highest portfolio value secured the first position, followed by the second and third highest.

After careful evaluation, the following teams emerged victorious:

- First Place- Team 9 (Anushka & Saksham Dalal)
- Second Place- Team 4 (Ashmit Jindal & Aashima)
- Third Place- Team 10 (Kanishk & Amisha)

Participant Feedback & Learning Outcomes

The participants found the competition to be an enriching and engaging experience. Key takeaways included:

- Understanding real-world stock trading principles.
- Developing negotiation and persuasion skills.
- Learning the impact of quick decision-making on investments.
- Enhancing financial literacy and stock market strategies.

An industrial visit to Liberty Shoes, Karnal, Haryana, was organized on February 13, 2024, for first-year MBA students of Section B. The primary objective of the visit was to provide students with industry exposure, enhance their understanding of supply chain and operational processes, and bridge the gap between classroom learning and real-world industrial practices.

Liberty Shoes Limited, Karnal, is a renowned Indian footwear company established in 1954 by Dharam Pal Gupta, Purshotam Das Gupta, and Rajkumar Bansal. With over 70 years of operation, the company manufactures approximately 60,000 pairs of footwear daily across its four manufacturing units in India. Liberty Shoes boasts around 15 footwear brands, including Fortune, Coolers, and Force 10.

The visit commenced with a briefing by Liberty's managers, who provided an overview of the company, its history, and its evolution over the years. They also introduced students to their product range and the various footwear variants produced at the plant.

Before touring the manufacturing site, students were divided into three groups, each accompanied by a development manager to explain the processes in detail. The students observed the entire manufacturing cycle, from designing and assembling the shoe upper and lower to the final stages of assembly and packaging for commercial distribution.

Following the site visit, students were served refreshments, including tea and snacks. A question-and-answer session was then conducted with Mr. Y.K. Sharma, HR Manager, along with the development manager. The discussion provided insights into the company's raw material procurement, logistics, nationwide operations, and competitive standing. Students actively engaged by posing various queries, all of which were addressed comprehensively by the officials.

The visit concluded with a group photograph of students and faculty. Overall, the industrial visit was highly informative and successful, offering students valuable industry exposure and practical insights into supply chain and operations management.

A brief introduction about the topic of the lecture:

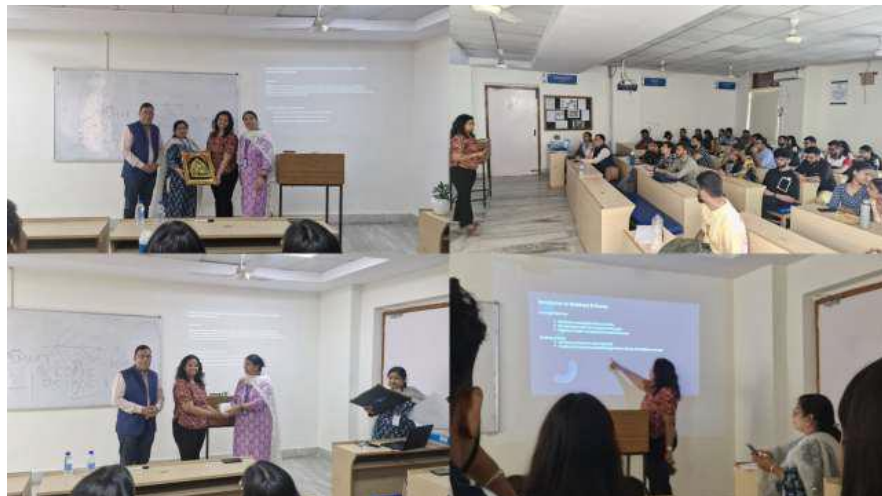
Utilizing quality tools in healthcare enables the identification and elimination of process bottlenecks, resulting in improved efficiency, cost reduction, and enhanced patient care. Implementing sustainable solutions ensures long-term improvements, making healthcare systems more adaptable and resilient to evolving challenges. The key quality tools highlighted include:

1. Process Mapping – Provides a visual representation of workflows to identify delays and inefficiencies.
2. Pareto Analysis – Helps pinpoint the most critical issues impacting healthcare processes.
3. Fishbone Diagram – Identifies root causes of bottlenecks.
4. Failure Mode and Effects Analysis (FMEA) – Evaluates risks and prioritizes preventive measures.
5. Six Sigma & Lean Techniques – Focuses on waste reduction, optimizing patient flow, and improving service delivery.

The speaker began by introducing the healthcare environment, its products, and the regulatory bodies overseeing pharmaceutical activities. This was followed by a discussion on the importance of quality management in the healthcare industry and the necessary steps to ensure compliance and efficiency.

Guiding the students through a series of slides, the speaker illustrated how a global healthcare equipment manufacturer and a leading pharmaceutical services provider faced challenges in managing inventory effectively. She emphasized the crucial role of Quality Leaders and their collaboration with specialized units in a continuous improvement initiative focused on streamlining Sales, Inventory, and Operations Planning (SIOP) processes to reduce the Cost of Goods Sold.

The session was highly informative and engaging, offering valuable insights into the application of quality management principles. The lecture enhanced students’ understanding of quality tools across various industries and successfully raised awareness about their significance.



Workshop on Sustainable Menstrual Health

The Social Impact & Sustainability Club – *Khushi*, under the Department of Management at Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Technology, successfully organized a hybrid workshop titled “**Sustainable Menstrual Health**” on April 4, 2025, in collaboration with **Stemz Healthcare**. The primary objective of the workshop was to raise awareness among young women about menstrual hygiene, challenge long-standing social taboos associated with menstruation, and promote sustainable practices that contribute to both personal health and environmental well-being.

The session was graced by **Ms. Sajal Jain**, Project Analyst at Stemz Healthcare, who served as the Guest Speaker. She shared valuable insights on effective menstrual health management, the importance of using eco-friendly menstrual products, and the long-term health and environmental benefits of sustainable hygiene practices. Her address strongly emphasized the need to normalize conversations around menstruation and highlighted how small, conscious lifestyle choices can lead to meaningful social and environmental change.

The event commenced with a warm welcome by **Dr. Anju Bharti**, Faculty Coordinator of the Social Impact & Sustainability Club. She introduced the theme of the workshop, formally welcomed the Guest Speaker, and underscored the importance of initiating open and informed discussions on menstrual health within academic institutions. She encouraged students to participate actively and approach the topic with openness and sensitivity.

Ms. Sajal Jain then delivered an engaging and informative session covering the biological, emotional, and societal dimensions of menstruation. She introduced sustainable alternatives to conventional menstrual products and explained their environmental advantages and cost-effectiveness. A key highlight of the session was the launch of a **bamboo fibre-based sanitary pad**, which was introduced as a sustainable and health-friendly option. Students actively participated in discussions, raising thoughtful questions related to menstrual challenges and the practicality of adopting sustainable solutions in everyday life.

As part of the collaboration, **pre- and post-evaluation forms** were shared with participants to assess awareness levels and gather feedback on the session and the product samples. Each student received a sample sanitary pad, and the feedback collected will assist Stemz Healthcare in refining future initiatives. Additionally, the distribution of sanitary pads to all participants has been scheduled as a follow-up activity.

In conclusion, the workshop proved to be a highly impactful initiative, contributing significantly to menstrual health education, sustainability awareness, and the empowerment of young women.
